Success Story of Md.Ameer

The Title Of the Story:-

Minority Farmer Md. Ameer become Ameer (Rich)

Sector:-

Animal Husbandry Department, Telangana Sate.

Introduction:-

Md.Ameer, S/o Md. Ismail, R/o Kondareddypally, Keshampet (Mandal), Ranga Reddy (Dist.).

Category:-

Agriculture farmer with 3 acres of land (2 acres dry land + 1 Acre wet) and his family is mainly dependent on agriculture farming.

<u>Previous background (Personal/Economical) along with Farming Experience & Financial Condition:</u>

They are having 2 small children. Sri. Md. Ameer and his father are small agriculture farmers and their family income previously was Rs. 1, 20,000/- per year through the agriculture farming.

Challenge (Problems & issues, opportunities):-

The income they earned from agriculture and other sources is not sufficient to meet the family expenditure and education of the Children.

Interventions / Initiatives:-

They have started Dairy farming during 2011-12 with four Cross bred cows.(HF,, Jersey cross) They slowly increased the stock to 16cows &8 Calves(a 6female calves and 2 male calves.), by doing AI, with the technical Advice and help of VAS, PVC, Keshampet.

The Dairy Farming Activities like cleaning the shed, feeding, milking, irrigation to fodder, cutting the fodder, chaffing the fodder etc..are taken up by himself and his father with out labour.

He is milking the cows with the help of milking machines and getting 140 liters daily. He has cultivated ½ acre of Co.4 and 1 acre of SSG green fodder. To conserve and reduce the fodder wastage, he is using chaff cutter for feeding of Animals.

He himself and father registered in the Vijaya Dairy Co operative Society and benefitted with 2 cross bred cows under milch animal distribution programme of Government with unit cost of Rs.80,000/- (50% subsidy). The milch animals were procured from Chintamani of Karnataka state with the help of VAS, PVC, Keshampet. Each cow is giving 8 liters average per day. The monthly income along with these two cows is Rs.1,26,000/- per month. He is having Vijaya dairy milk collection center Agency in the village and getting extra income with the Agency.

Present Position (Personal / Economical)

During this 6 years the Crossbred cow stock have increased to 16 number. They are having 8 calves also with 3 months to 18 months age. (6 females & 2 males). They have allotted 1.5 acres of land exclusively for fodder cultivation. (0.5 acre of Co.4 perineal fodder).

Results and Outputs:-

They have raised fodder which is sufficient to feed the 16 cows and 8 calves. The milk production in the farm every day is 140 liters per day. The milk is sold to Vijaya dairy collection centre in the village and getting Rs.4200/- per day. He is also having agency Vijaya dairy milk collection centre in the village, through which he is getting extra income. Their Annual income through Dairy farming is Rs.5,40,000/-beside agriculture income.

Awards and recognitions:-

VAS, PVC, Keshampet, Rangareddy District is giving continuous technical support (deworming, Vaccinations and health care etc..

Lessons Learnt & Message to Fellow Farmers:

The other farmers in the village inspired and motivated by the success of Sri. Md. Ameer in dairy farming and also by his annual income. They have also started doing Dairy Farming.
